Despite all this great work and engagement, when I ask the pupils at lunch or in class, "What are you learning today?" I occasionally get the response which, as a parent, I remember my own children sometimes saying, which might simply be "Errrrm..." I am sure you have these conversations with your children, and do keep these up. Asking what they have been learning in specific subjects or even asking them to teach you something that they have learned will help reinforce and deepen their understanding. It is helpful to ask specific questions e.g. "Can you tell me about the story you've read", "What did you learn in Maths" or "Can you show me how to..." – especially when around the dinner table and you have a static audience.
