### Reminders:

Catering: for parents who ordered catered meals with the manual ordering system (via direct email to the school), which occurred for the first few days of term, please be aware that Innovate will have to request a retrospective payment on the system which should appear on your account soon. Thank you for embracing the changes recently - further refinements are further down the line. Most importantly however, I have it on good authority ie. directly from the children, that the quality of the food has improved which is always pleasing to hear. Please be gently reminded that parents need to order their children's meals for the week ahead by no later than each Saturday at 1130pm.

Parking: we have received an email from a local resident of Primrose Lea regarding the difficulties residents have parking in their own road. They are often unable to access or park outside their own homes. We would ask parents who drive to pick up their children to be aware of this. We are aware that the issue is more difficult with the temporary roadworks but politely request you find considerate places to park which do not block drives or corners (including the corner of Prospect Road). If you are worried about parking further away from school and being late to collect your child, please be confident in the knowledge that they will always be safe and supervised until they are collected.

**Flu immunisation:** this is due to take place in school on Monday. If you have not yet responded to the Bucks link sent directly to you, then please do so at the earliest opportunity.
