Theme of the week: The eternal prize

Joe Richardson the SEL of St Thomas Catholic Academies Trust came and worked with various classes, assisted in

Finally, Pauline Cuddihy, the Director of Schools across the Diocese of Northampton came and spoke with staff in the afternoon about the new RE curriculum which is rolling out across our schools over the next two years. They are exploring the different types of animals, weather and ways of life which can be experienced there and could speak beautifully about the challenges of the climate, the problems encountered there, as well as looking at ways people can try to help the area remain sustainable.

Y3 and 4's recent Science project on the human skeleton was rounded up with a competition and prizes for the models made for homework. From stop/start animations, to Powerpoint displays, to clay models and to almost life size mock ups, the effort was tremendous by all. Particular congratulations to Amara, Loic and Timothy for their 1st, 2nd and 3rd place awards!





Also on Tuesday, Years 5 and 6 were fully involved in their Biodiversity Day. Mrs Colley and Miss Eaves, ably assisted by Mrs Passler and Mrs Taylor (thank you!), led the creation of



a Toad Sanctuary in the garden, creating bird feeders for the trees and a whole host of other activities. Mrs Hughes and the children counted and noted different types of wildlife in various sections of the bushes and trees around school to encourage an understanding of ecosystems and what else we share our site with!
