Theme of the week:

True Greatness: This week we explored how true greatness comes in the form of putting the needs of others first, not necessarily by 'being the best' at any one skill. The essence of serving others is the way which we can bring joy and hope to others, especially those in greater need than ourselves.



In science this week, St. Bernadette's carried out an investigation to find out if the length of a person's femur determines how far they can jump.

The children measured each other's femurs using metre sticks, marked their jumps using chalk and measured the distance they were able to jump. -and had a lot of fun in the process!

This week – thank you to everyone for bearing with the weather so positively this week and for bringing the children to school dry and happy! It's quite a contrast to last week weather wise and I'm mindful of requesting that the children are brought to school in appropriate footwear ie. in uniform shoes, as opposed to trainers (unless it's a PE day), to prevent them from getting unnecessarily wet feet, which can be uncomfortable for them during the day.
